FAMILIES ACHIEVING SUCCESS ANTI-RACISM

- 1) We advocate for equity and inclusion within school districts
- 2) We teach African American students and parents to advocate for themselves
- 3) We help African American and Biracial students who are struggling with their identity
- 4) We teach students, parents, staff and teachers about microaggressions, racism, school culture and school climate
- 5) We bring attention to the school to prison pipeline, disproportionate test scores, suspension rates and low graduation rates
- 6) We dispel stereotypes and untruths about the African American culture
- 7) We educate teachers on how to engage with African American parents and families
- 8) We encourage school districts to support programs for African American students and to create an Anti-Racism Pledge/Policy or Equity Statements
- 9) We refer students to the Black Student Advocate, LLC when needed
- 10) We work closely with African American Success Committees, African American Parent Advisory Councils, Black Student Unions, The National Association for Advancement Colored People and other African American parenting and community groups

THE MAGIC OF MINDFULNESS

Families Achieving Success teaches students mindfulness techniques through our Mindfulness Monday Sessions. In our Positive Parenting Program we teach parents mindfulness and positive coping skills. We help participants decrease poor coping choices and be positive choice makers.

Students and families are taught to accept the moment just the way it is, without judgement. Participants are also encouraged to be congruent in their life.



KUUMBA

"Each morning when you wake up, bow three times before the mirror" and say, "The world is a better place because I am here." ~Virginia Satir

Families Achieving Success teaches our participants through the Principle of Kuumba, that their presence should leave the world more beautiful and beneficial than they inherited it.

We encourage students and parents to utilize positive affirmations and positive self-talk daily. Our programs include affirmation circles, in which students affirm themselves and affirm each other.

TRANSFORMATION

"Our behavior reflects what we have learned. Learning is the basis of behavior. To change behavior, we need to have new learning." ~Virginia Satir



Families Achieving Success programs teach participants new skills, tools and techniques to help them transform, become whole and have more positive behaviors. We help participants increase selfworth and self-esteem, be more responsible and be positive choice makers.








INTERCONNECTEDNESS

"I believe the greatest gift I can conceive of having from anyone is to be seen by them, heard by them, to be understood and touched by them. The greatest gift I can give is to see, hear, understand and to touch another person. When this is done I feel contact has been made." ~Virginia Satir



Families Achieving Success prides ourselves in seeing, hearing, understanding and nurturing our participants. Using the Principle of Interconnectedness we teach participants to build and maintain brotherhood, sisterhood and community.

In our program we use the call and response "Ago" and "Ame" which means "Do you hear me?" and "Yes, I hear you." This is used to ensure that we are listening and being heard by one another. When the response "Ame" is given we know that contact has been made.



KUJICHAGULIA



"We must not allow other people's limited perceptions to define us." "I am Me. In all the world, there is no one else exactly like me." ~Virginia Satir

Families Achieving Success teaches students to be their authentic self. Through the Nguzo Saba Principle of Kujichagulia (Self-determination) our students are taught to define themselves, name themselves, create for themselves and speak for themselves instead of being defined, named, created and spoken for by others.


OUR CURRENT NEEDS
